How Majestic is Your Name

Have you ever wandered through one of the Queen's many palaces? If you have, then I wonder what feelings you were left with. In times past, medieval palaces weren't just places for the good and the great to safely store their amazing wealth, or for them to hide in when things were tough. Their impressive features, contents and architecture communicated to visitors exactly who it was they were dealing with!

In medieval times, court officials wouldn't dream of bringing visitors to the palace through a side entrance directly to the throne. Instead they would be led through room after impressive room—each filled with magnificent furniture and paintings displaying the owner's heritage. It was meant to drive home the importance of the person they had come to see, and to remind them of their own position. So, overawed by all that they had witnessed, and convinced of the power and authority of the person into whose presence they found themselves, they would have quite literally been on their knees.

We live in a beautiful part of the UK – an area of incredible mountains, lakes, open spaces and wildlife. Tourists value the chance to walk the hills, or just soak up all this magnificence (that isn't intended as a pun about all our rain). And I know how they feel. Each day I get into my car to drive down Coniston Water and around the Bay to my office in Sandside. What I see on that journey often brings me to a stop to make the most of yet another photo opportunity.

I know that others may take a different view, but as a Christian, I look at the beauty of the world like I have just walked through a Medieval Palace. I am totally overawed by the majesty and magnificence of God and it brings me, metaphorically, to my knees as I acknowledge His authority and control. And the tremendous privilege is that I get to enjoy this beauty every day as I look at the Coniston massif or marvel at the birds in my garden, butterflies in the hedgerows, Grey Heron by Yewdale Beck or the Herdwick sheep all over the place (even on the road at Blawith Common).

I see my amazement at the beauty of it all reflected in Psalm 8 of the Bible. It was written by King David (of Goliath fame). Even though he faced some tough situations, he declared "LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!" David clearly sees God's handiwork in all the things around him.

And it leads him to ask the sort of question that comes to mind when you've had a glimpse of God's greatness; how immense and complicated everything His creation is; and just how small and insignificant we are in comparison. David says: "When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them?"

A valid question given how much we try to live our lives our own way without involving God. But the Bible tells us that He made us in His image, and that we were given a special role: to rule over the things that He created. But we messed things up by wanting to be in charge of everything and sit on God's throne. The Bible calls this sin. There's an acronym that captures the feelings behind this rebellion. It's as if we are saying: Shove off God, I'm in charge, No to God's rule.

But despite all of this, God—whose creation, power and authority is so amazing—showed us that He remembers us. How? He gave us Jesus—whose birth we celebrate at Christmas, and whose death and resurrection we remember at Easter—to be a way back to God when we trust in Him.

September has been a month where we celebrate the wonder of the harvest, while October is a month where we really notice the seasons change. The fells turn rust and yellow, the last of the leaves fall from the trees. The summer visitors (birds and tourists) have flown south, and many of our animals prepare for the harsher months ahead. But still the beauty of creation remains and, like David, I want to declare "LORD, our Lord, how majestic is all your name in all the earth!"

Tarn News Update Sept. 2017

It is now three years since the X112 bus service started, arising out of the scrapping of bus subsidies by Cumbria County Council in 2014. In that time Blueworks Taxis, who run the service, have been supported by the local community to enable it to survive. The support is being organised through the 'Friends of the X112' group. So what have we learnt in these three years?

Firstly there is a need to keep this service running. Many people, both locals and visitors, rely totally on the bus for their way of getting out and about and we all never know when we might be in that same position.

Secondly the support from the community to fund raising efforts has been magnificent. So many people are contributing in so many ways.

Thirdly a rural bus service like ours cannot possibly survive without support from somewhere. While we hope support from the community will continue the 'Friends' group are actively seeking ways in which to provide a more secure future for the service. All ideas are welcome as are offers to join the 'Friends' committee.

Coniston Parish Council

August Meeting

PCSO Emma Forrester attending our August meeting and confirmed she is leaving as a PCSO to commence training as a Police Constable and Councillors thanked her for her work and wished her well. Carol Last from Cumbria County Council attended to discuss the VC plaque Coniston will receive in April 2018 to commemorate James Hewitson receiving the VC 100 years ago. Councillors would like to plan a village event to celebrate and if you have any ideas or would like to be involved please let us know. Dr Charlotte Hall from South Cumbria Rivers Trust / Coniston & Crake Catchment Partnership gave an update on the project in the area. This will include work on physical habitat improvements, water course fencing, uncovering becks, improving habitats in rivers, more variation and restoring reed beds on Coniston water. A response is expected by the end of September on a Lengthsman Agreement with Cumbria County Council. Following the Montane Lakeland 50/100 Event on 29th / 30th July there have been several reports of noise especially from cow bells and the inappropriate attitude of spectators during the evening and throughout the night. As a result Councillors have invited the organisers of this event to the October meeting to discuss the issues and work to prevent them at future events. Jeff Hart has resigned as Parish Councillor.

Campbell Memorial

South Lakeland District Council have confirmed that the two trees on the piece of green by the Campbell Memorial, Tilberthwaite Avenue need to be removed. As a result this is the opportunity to redevelop the area, dependent on what funding will be available. Councillors would like to if anyone has any ideas on what could be done in this area and what people would like to see. Please contact the Clerk with ideas before Monday 9th October.

Coniston Parish Council is working with Cumbria County Council Highways Department to improve the roads and verges in the Parish. In their budgeting for the precept for 2017/18 money was allocated for a Lengthsman for the area to work on ensuring drains are running, clearing verges, etc. Although a draft Lengthsman Agreement went to Highways for their approval in April 2017 they are reviewing these agreements and will not be approved until at least the end of September. Hopefully as soon as this is in place we can use local contractors to have this work carried out.

To assist with ensuring roads and footpaths are clear Councillors would be grateful if people could ensure that if they have any trees / hedges on their land that these are cut back to ensure they do not encroach or overhang from their boundaries. This will ensure that roads and footpaths are kept as clear as possible.
