

Housing for village people and families

Late last year the Housing Group (Coniston and Torver Community Land Trust) carried out a Housing Needs Survey of the parish. This survey was not intended to give details of all people who are in need of an affordable home to rent but to give us an idea of the total number of new homes we are likely to need over the next three years.

The survey was very successful and results showed that there is a need for 30 additional homes. Both our housing and planning authorities have approved the results. We have got off to a good start in that 10 of these are already being developed at the St Andrews site and there are 7 additional ones in the pipeline as well. Over the next couple of years we will try to complete the number if more sites come available.

Work is now progressing with the ten homes on the St Andrews site. We estimate that they might be available for occupancy in late November so long as there are no unforeseen delays. This means that allocation of the homes will probably take place in September / October.

Allocation will be carried out by Eden Housing. We know that there are many young village families and several individuals who are interested in applying for the units. It is essential that they register on the Cumbria Choice system in good time and those who are already on Cumbria Choice should check that the information that is on the system is correct. There are strict criteria laid down by the authorities governing who can apply. Basically they must be village families or they must have moved to the village to take up full-time, permanent (i.e. for 12 months of the year) employment.

Registering with Cumbria Choice must be carried out on line. If anyone has any questions or problems when registering please contact a member of the Housing Group or the Parish Council. Alastair Cameron

Bridging the Gap Hearing Aid Service

The monthly drop-in held at The Village Institute, Coniston continues to run on the 1st Wednesday of the month between 10.30 and 11.30am. Hearing aids may be cleaned, re-tubed and NHS batteries provided. Advice may also be provided on hearing aids and their use and information on equipment specific for hearing loss.

As we are a charity we rely on the backing from our funders and the support from our volunteers. We also accept donations from our users who appreciate the provision of a local service and help to keep the service running. Our current funding does run out at the end of May this year and we are presently placing bids for further funding. We are very hopeful that we will be successful and will be able to continue to provide this much needed service in your area and around Cumbria. I will keep you updated when I have further information.

I am happy to say that I have appointed a new volunteer to help at Coniston drop-in. She lives locally and will help with the issuing of batteries.

Problems with a mobile phone contract

I recently signed a two year phone contract with a new network provider but the reception in my home is terrible. Can I cancel the contract? Poor signal doesn't give you a right to cancel, but you can take action. If you bought your mobile online or over the phone within the last 14 days, simply cancel the contract. If you bought it in store or have had it for longer, explain the problem to the company. They may give you a device which can boost your signal.

If this doesn't work, ask to terminate the contract. They will usually ask you to pay an exit fee, which can cost as much as the contract. If you don't want to pay then use their complaints procedure. If you haven't got a resolution after 8 weeks, ask an Alternative Dispute Resolution Service to make a decision on releasing you from the contract.
