The Republic of Burundi, located in East Africa, is one of the poorest in the world. Ninety five percent of the population of 12 million live in extreme rural poverty, struggling to grow food for their families. On top of this there have been years of malaria and malnutrition and now the Covid 19 epidemic with very sparse healthcare provision.

In the midst of these desperate needs, the Bethesda Project - a joint initiative between The Diocese of Muyinga and the Kepplewray Trust - sends healthcare outreach workers to minister to village communities and provide support, equipment for disabilities and access to education and healthcare. In 2020 their ancient but essential 4x4 vehicle had to be scrapped as it had become a danger to drive.

We are now launching an appeal to provide a pre-owned replacement, the cost of which will be at least £20,000.
